CHRISTIAN HISTORY: AD 500 TO 1500

DERIOD MARKED BY TERRITORIAL DECLINE, SCHISM, PAPAL ELEVATION AND CORRUPTION, SCHOLASTICISM AND BEGINNINGS OF REFORM

TERRITORIAL DECLINE:

- FURTHER COLLAPSE OF THE ROMAN EMPIRE :
 - BARBARIANS (NORTH)
 - MUSLIMS (SOUTH)
- CHRISTIANITY ASSIMILATES NORTHERN INVADERS:
 - CLOVIS OF THE FRANKS BAPTIZED (AD 476)
 - CONVERSION OF THE ANGLO-SAXONS IN ENGLAND BEGINS (AD 596)
 - CONVERSION OF GERMANS FOLLOWED

TERRITORIAL DECLINE (CONT):

- CHRISTIANITY DID NOT ASSIMILATE ISLAMIC INVADERS:
 - BY AD 950, HALF OF ORIGINAL ROMAN EMPIRE LOST TO MUSLIMS
 - ALL TERRITORY SOUTH AND EAST OF THE MEDITERRANEAN
 - MOST OF SPAIN

SCHISM BETWEEN EAST AND WEST

- DIVIDE CONTINUES TO GROW:
 - EAST STILL FIRMLY ENTRENCHED IN ROMAN/BYZANTINE EMPIRE
 - WEST DOMINATED BY FRANKISH/GERMANIC INFLUENCE

SCHISM BETWEEN EAST AND WEST (CONT):

- SPECIFIC WESTERN EUROPEAN INFLUENCES:
 - FRANKISH "CAROLINGIAN" EMPIRE (AD 650 -850) REACHES PREEMINANCE UNDER CHARLEMAGNE
 - GERMAN "HOLY ROMAN" EMPIRE BEGINS UNDER OTTO I (THE GREAT) IN AD 962 AND EXTENDS PAST REFORMATION TIMES
- THEOLOGICAL DISPUTES OVER "FILIOQUE" (AD 860), ROME'S USE OF LEAVENED COMMUNION BREAD, UNMARRIED PRIESTS, ETC.
- GROWTH OF ROMAN/PAPAL CLAIMS ANGERS EAST
- MUTUAL EXCOMMUNICATION IN AD 1054

TERRITORIAL RENEWAL BEGINNING IN 10TH CENTURY:

• EUROPEANS RETAKE SOME MUSLIM TERRITORY (SPAIN & HOLY LANDS VIA CRUSADES)

CRUSADES:

- FOUR MAJOR CRUSADES PLUS CHILDREN'S CRUSADE TO RETAKE HOLY LAND FROM MUSLIM TURKS
- AD 1096 POPE URBAN II, BASED ON REQUEST FROM BYZANTINE EMPEROR, PROMISES 'PLENARY INDULGENCE' AND ETERNAL LIFE
 - ONLY CRUSADE SUCCESSFUL IN ITS MILITARY OBJECTIVES
- OTHER CRUSADES -- 1144, 1189, 1202

CRUSADES (CONT):

- 4TH CRUSADE (1202) NOTABLE IN DEEPENING THE RIFT BETWEEN EAST AND WEST:
 - CRUSADERS PLUNDER CONSTANTINOPLE IN AD 1204
 - EASTERN MASSES RESENT/RESIST LATIN INFLUENCE
 - CONSTANTINOPLE RESTORED TO BYZANTINES IN AD 1261
- CHILDREN'S CRUSADE RESULTS IN CAPTURE AND SALE OF UP TO 30,000 YOUTHS

D PAPAL ELEVATION & CORRUPTION:

• GENERAL STATE AUTHORITY OVER THE CHURCH UNTIL 11TH CENTURY

D PAPAL ELEVATION:

- STATE UTILIZED 'LAY INVESTITURES' TO CONTROL RELIGIOUS INFLUENCE
 - BRIBERY AND SIMONY BECAME PREVALENT
- HILDEBRANDT (GREGORY VII) REVERSES TREND BEGINNING IN 1073:
 - "ROMAN CHURCH FOUNDED BY GOD ALONE"
 - "OF THE POPE ALONE, THE PRINCES MAY KISS THE FEET"
 - "A SENTENCE PASSED BY THE POPE MAY BE RETRACTED BY NO ONE SAVE THE POPE"
 - "THE POPE MAY BE JUDGED BY NO ONE"
 - "ROMAN CHURCH HAS NEVER ERRED; NOR WILL IT ERR TO ALL ETERNITY"

D PAPAL ELEVATION (CONT):

- REIGN OF POPE INNOCENT III (1198-1216) "THE CULMINATION OF PAPAL THEOCRACY"
 - "THE POPE STANDS IN THE MIDST BETWEEN GOD AND MAN; BELOW GOD, ABOVE MAN"
 - INNOCENT BECOMES MOST POWERFUL POPE IN CHURCH-STATE ISSUES:
 - IN ROME, CIVIL OFFICIALS ACKNOWLEDGE HIM AS SOVEREIGN
 - IN GERMANY, INSTRUMENTAL IN REPLACING OTTO IV WITH FREDRICK II
 - IN ENGLAND, DEPOSED KING JOHN OVER ARCHBISHOP OF CANTERBURY
- AFTER INNOCENT III, SLOW DECLINE OF PAPAL POWER AND INCREASE OF PAPAL CORRUPTION

D PAPAL CORRUPTION:

- "BABYLONIAN CAPTIVITY" OF THE PAPACY (1309-1377):
 - CLEMENT V UNDER INFLUENCE OF PHILIP OF FRANCE MOVES PAPAL HQ TO AVIGNON (AD 1309)
 - "AVIGNON POPES" RULE UNTIL 1376
 - MORAL TURPITUDE AMONGST "AVIGNON POPES"
 - SELF INDULGENCE, EXTORTION, SEXUAL IMMORALITY
 - GREGORY XI RETURNS TO ROME AD 1376
 - DIES WITHIN 2 YRS
 - ITALIANS DEMAND ITALIAN POPE
 - FRENCH CARDINALS CONCEDE NAME URBAN VI

D PAPAL CORRUPTION (CONT):

- "BABYLONIAN CAPTIVITY" OF THE PAPACY (CONT):
 - ONCE SEATED, URBAN VI ALIENATES FRENCH CARDINALS
 - CARDINALS RETURN TO FRANCE & INSTATE CLEMENT VII IN AVIGNON
 - TWO SIMULTANEOUS "POPES"
 - COUNCIL OF PISA TO REMEDY SITUATION (AD 1409)
 - DEPOSE TWO POPES & INSTATE ALEXANDER V
 - COUNCIL FAILS THREE SIMULTENEOUS "POPES"
 - COUNCIL OF CONSTANCE (AD 1414)
 - REQUIRES ABDICATION OF ALL 3 POPES
 - APPOINTS MARTIN V (AD 1417)

D PAPAL CORRUPTION (CONT):

• CONTINUED MORAL DECLINE OF THE PAPACY:

- SIXTUS IV (AD 1471-1484)
 - PLUNGED HIMSELF & THE PAPACY INTO DEBT VIA INDULGENCE & HIGH LIVING, DIED AT AGE 28
- INNOCENT VIII (AD 1484-1492)
 - NUMEROUS (7-12) CHILDREN CONCEIVED BY DIFFERENT WOMEN
 - USED POLITICAL POWER TO FURTHER CHILDREN'S INTERESTS
- ALEXANDER VI (AD 1492-1503)
 - "CLIMAX OF PAPAL WICKEDNESS"
 - EXTRAVAGANT WOMANIZER, MURDERER, AND FURTHERER OF CHILDREN'S INTERESTS
 - SON, CAESAR BORGIA, HELD PARTY AT VATICAN WHERE 50 PROSTITUTES DANCED NAKED, PICKED CHESTNUTS OFF THE FLOOR WITH THEIR TEETH, & WERE 'AUCTIONED' TO MEN PRESENT

SCHOLASTICISM:

- DOMINATES UNIVERSITIES (11TH-13TH CENT)
- ATTEMPTS TO FUSE CATHOLIC FAITH & PHILOSOPHY
 - ANSELM (AD 1034-1109)
 - "PROVE GOD FROM REASON; APART FROM SCRIPTURE"
 - LOMBARD
 - AUTHOR OF "FOUR SENTENCES" MOST WIDELY USED THEOLOGICAL TEXTBOOK DURING MIDDLE AGES
 - AQUINAS (C.1224)
 - MOST WELL KNOWN OF SCHOLASTIC THINKERS
 - RECONCILIATION OF ARISTOTLIAN LOGIC WITH CHRISTIANITY (FAITH & REASON)
 - INSTRUMENTAL IN MAINTAINING CHRISTIAN 'RELEVANCE' AS PHILOSOPHY BECAME MORE INSTRUMENTAL IN ACADEMIA

BEGINNINGS OF REFORM:

- JOHN WYCLIFFE (AD 1320-1384) "MORNING STAR OF THE REFORMATION"
 - UNTIL AD 1365, OXFORD SCHOLASTIC PHILOSOPHER
 - IN AD 1366, BEGINNING OF REFORMS:
 - "WE SHOULD BELIEVE THE AUTHORITY OF NO MAN UNLESS HE SAY THE WORD OF GOD"
 - "BELIEVERS SHOULD ASCERTAIN FOR THEMSELVES...BY HAVING THE SCRIPTURES IN A LANGUAGE THEY CAN UNDERSTAND"
 - ON INDULGENCES "THEY (PRELATES) CHATTER ON THE SUBJECT OF GRACE AS IF IT WERE SOMETHING TO BE SOLD LIKE AN ASS OR AN OX"
 - "AS THE SCRIPTURE ASSURETH US, CHRIST IS THE ONLY MEDIATOR BETWEEN GOD AND MAN"
 - "IT IS SUPPOSED, WITH GREAT PROBABILITY, THAT THE ROMAN PONTIFF IS THE GREAT ANTICHRIST"

BEGINNINGS OF REFORM (CONT):

• JOHN WYCLIFFE (CONT)

- ORGANIZATION OF THE "POOR PRIESTS"
 - LAY PREACHERS TEACH THE BIBLE IN LANGUAGE UNDERSTANDABLE BY THE COMMON FOLK
 - WANDERERS FROM TOWN TO TOWN; TEACHING WHERE THEY FOUND HEARERS
- TRANSLATION OF THE BIBLE TO ENGLISH
 - FIRST VERSION COMPLETE IN 1382
 - REVISION COMPLETED IN 1388--WIDELY CIRCULATED THROUGHOUT ENGLAND
- WYCLIFFE DIED IN 1384--IN COMMUNION WITH THE CHURCH
 - BODY EXHUMED AND BURNED IN 1415, AFTER THE COUNCIL OF CONSTANCE CONDEMNS HIS TEACHINGS AS HERITICAL

BEGINNINGS OF REFORM (CONT):

• JOHN HUSS (AD 1369-1415) OF BOHEMIA

- DEAN OF FACULTY OF ARTS--UNIVERSITY OF PRAGUE (AD 1401)
 - TOOK ON OFFICE OF PREACHER AT BETHLEHEM CHAPEL--PREACHING IN THE "VERNACULAR"
- HUSS' TEACHING DRAWS IRE OF ARCHBISHOP OF PRAGUE (AD 1410)
 - DENOUNCES INIQUITY OF THE CLERGY/PAPACY
 - ADVOCACY OF WYCLIFFE'S POSITIONS WHICH WERE SCRUTINIZED & CONDEMNED AS EARLY AS 1403
 - BITTER CRITICISM OF POPE JOHN'S INDULGENCES MET POPULAR APPEAL
- HUSS PUBLICLY EXCOMMUNICATED (1412)
 - TAKES REFUGE WITH FRIENDLY NOBLES
 - PUBLISHES DE ECCLESIA-MOST FAMOUS WORK

BEGINNINGS OF REFORM (CONT):

- JOHN HUSS (CONT)
 - COUNCIL OF CONSTANCE (1414)
 - HUSS REQUESTED TO DEFEND HIS POSITION UNDER "SAFE CONDUCT" EDICT FROM THE EMPEROR
 - HUSS ARRESTED AND TRIED IN JUNE, 1415 DESPITE "SAFE CONDUCT" PLEDGE
 - AFTER REFUSING BLANKET RECANTATION OF HIS WRITINGS, HUSS MEETS FINAL SENTENCE IN JULY, 1415
 - HUSS BURNED AT THE STAKE IN 1415
